Key messages

- The APA is meeting with MPs and Senators from across the political spectrum to advocate for an amendment of the Aged Care Funding Instrument and ongoing telehealth funding.
- The Federal Government is expected to announce an extension of MBS-funded telehealth, possibly until the end of March. The APA is also calling for permanent funding and has convened a roundtable of key stakeholders to share evidence and understand how best to support members in telehealth education and use.

DVA	 APA attended DVA's health provider forum this week. We sought clarification about ongoing provision of telehealth funding. DVA confirmed it would follow any Department of Health moves. The new Veterans Card final issue is nearing completion. Clients can continue to use their old cards until new ones arrive. A new 1800 VETERANS help line is now available for clients that will transfer veterans to the relevant assistance as the department moves toward a single contact number. The 1800 number for providers has not changed. Veterans Week will be held from 24 October to 1 November and the theme is social connection.
